## Intro to Scripture

Romans 8:12–17

In Romans 7, Paul describes the human condition as our inability to do the good called for by the law because we are of the flesh and enslaved to sin. Today's Epistle reading is part of Paul's description of God's answer to this dilemma: God's gift of life in the Spirit through Jesus Christ.

John 3:1–17

Today's Gospel lesson is the story of Nicodemus coming to Jesus by night. Jesus tells of God's love in terms of our being born from above. As with Paul's description of salvation in our reading from Romans, the Gospel of John also employs language that helped the church shape its doctrine of the Trinity

## Scripture

# Romans 8:12-17 (CEB)

<sup>12</sup> So then, brothers and sisters, we have an obligation, but it isn't an obligation to ourselves to live our lives on the basis of selfishness. <sup>13</sup> If you live on the basis of selfishness, you are going to die. But if by the Spirit you put to death the actions of the body, you will live. <sup>14</sup> All who are led by God's Spirit are God's sons and daughters. <sup>15</sup> You didn't receive a spirit of slavery to lead you back again into fear, but you received a Spirit that shows you are adopted as his children. With this Spirit, we cry, "Abba, Father." <sup>16</sup> The same Spirit agrees with our spirit, that we are God's children. <sup>17</sup> But if we are children, we are also heirs. We are God's heirs and fellow heirs with Christ, if we really suffer with him so that we can also be glorified with him.

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#### John 3:1-17 (CEB)

**3** There was a Pharisee named Nicodemus, a Jewish leader. <sup>2</sup> He came to Jesus at night and said to him, "Rabbi, we know that you are a teacher who has come from God, for no one could do these miraculous signs that you do unless God is with him."

<sup>3</sup> Jesus answered, "I assure you, unless someone is born anew,<sup>[a]</sup> it's not possible to see God's kingdom."

<sup>4</sup>Nicodemus asked, "How is it possible for an adult to be born? It's impossible to enter the mother's womb for a second time and be born, isn't it?"

<sup>5</sup> Jesus answered, "I assure you, unless someone is born of water and the Spirit, it's not possible to enter God's kingdom. <sup>6</sup> Whatever is born of the flesh is flesh, and whatever is born of the Spirit is spirit. <sup>7</sup> Don't be surprised that I said to you, 'You must be born anew.' <sup>8</sup> God's Spirit<sup>[b]</sup> blows wherever it wishes. You hear its sound, but you don't know where it comes from or where it is going. It's the same with everyone who is born of the Spirit."

<sup>9</sup>Nicodemus said, "How are these things possible?"

<sup>10</sup> "Jesus answered, "You are a teacher of Israel and you don't know these things? <sup>11</sup> I assure you that we speak about what we know and testify about what we have seen, but you don't receive our testimony. <sup>12</sup> If I have told you about earthly things and you don't believe, how will you believe if I tell you about heavenly things? <sup>13</sup> No one has gone up to heaven except the one who came down from heaven, the Human One.<sup>[C]</sup> <sup>14</sup> Just as Moses lifted up the snake in the wilderness, so must the Human One.<sup>[d]</sup> be lifted up <sup>15</sup> so that everyone who believes in him will have eternal life. <sup>16</sup> God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him won't perish but will have eternal life. <sup>17</sup> God didn't send his Son into the world to judge the world, but that the world might be saved through him.
