Household Prayer: Evening

God of mercy, I come to you now with my energy running low as the lights of the evening. Like stars in the darkness, I send out my prayers for justice to you.

May this small effort of mine send a ray of hope, to someone facing the darkness of trial or terror tonight. I know how strong evil and injustice still are in this world, yet I know you are stronger than even the worst we

can do.

So, I do not lose heart; rather, my heart rests in gratitude to you: for the gift of life, for the comforts of faith and those who are family to me, and for the hope you have given us all in Christ's rising from the dead.

I pray this night for peace among all people, in the name of him who came to bring peace unlike any the world can give, Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.
