## Food for Thought

#### Romans 12:9-21; Matthew 16: 21-28

How do you personally receive the idea that people who commit great acts of evil are loved by God and worthy of grace?

Does that belief make sense to you? Why or why not?

Sometimes we suffer betrayals and cruelty without the hope of receiving justice. What does the process of healing look like when there is no possibility for restoration? What does it mean to you to "not be overcome by evil, but to overcome evil with good"?

The Table of Hospitality requires much of us.

It demands that we question our own boundaries of "who is in" and "who is out."

It asks us to accept that the Spirit may move in surprising ways, through surprising people, and we might just miss out on the beauty and fullness of life if we insist on limiting invitations to the feast.

God of hospitality, today help us to live peaceably with all.

Help us live in genuine love: to love our neighbors as ourselves, and to love you, O God, with our whole heart, mind, and strength.
