

Question for Reflection

The Christian life is one of constant renewal, turning and returning to God. The Prophets Isaiah, Ezekiel and Amos all wrote to the rulers of cities: My soul hates your worship mixed with your hypocrisy! Instead, learn to do good and seek justice: rescue the oppressed, defend the orphans, and treat the widows fairly! (Isa 1:10-17); This was the guilt of Sodom: they were arrogant, they had prosperous ease and excess of food, and yet they did not aid the poor and the needy (Ezek 16:49); You who oppress the poor and crush the needy . . .I shall overthrow you as I overthrew Sodom and Gomorrah (Amos 4:1,11). What would the Prophets say to the leaders of the nations today?
